1 RULES

- 1.1 The event will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS).
- 1.2 The class rules of the participating classes will apply and are located online as follows:

- 1.3 RRS 40.1 will apply.
- 1.4 RRS Appendix P will apply to all classes except 420 White Sail and Optimist Green and is amended as follows: P2.2 and P2.3 are deleted. P2.1 will apply to the second and subsequent penalties.
- 1.5 RRS 63.1, A3 and A5 will be changed to permit scoring penalties for failure to comply with check-in/checkout procedures outlined in the Sailing Instructions.
- 1.6 RRS Appendix T will apply.
- 1.7 The Sail Canada prescriptions shall apply. www.sailing.ca/wp-content/uploads/2025/01/Sail-Canada-Prescriptions-to-the-RRS-2025-2028_revfinal-1.pdf

2. ADVERTISING

Advertising shall be in accordance with World Sailing Regulation 20 Section 2.

3. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- 3.1 The sailing instructions will be available after 11:00 am on July 14, 2025 at https://theclubspot.com/regatta/ZQMRkkKPrU
- 3.2 The sailing instructions will consist of the instructions in RRS Appendix S, Standard Sailing Instructions, and supplementary sailing instructions that will be on the official notice board located at https://theclubspot.com/regatta/ZQMRkkKPrU and may be posted under the Event tent.

4 COMMUNICATION

From the first warning signal until the end of the last race of the day, except in an emergency, a boat shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats.

5 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 5.1 The event is open to boats of the Optimist, 1LCA 4, ILCA 6, 29er and Club 420 (white sail & spinnaker) and any other class with five (5) entries or more. Coaching is permitted while racing in the back third of the fleet.
- 5.2 Registration for this event may **only be completed ONLINE at** https://theclubspot.com/register/regatta/ZQMRkkKPrU/class and will open on or before

6.2 A full refund, less a \$25.00 processing fee, will be granted to those entries cancelled before July 10, 2025. A 50% refund of the registration fee will be granted to those entries cancelled before 11:59 pm on Tuesday, July 15, 2025. No refunds will be granted after 11:59 pm on Tuesday, July 15, 2025.

7 CREW LIMITATIONS

The following crew limitations apply: competitors who are enrolled in a Learn to Sail program. Graduates of Learn to Sail programs may compete but will be excluded from team scoring.

8.2 Number of races

All Classes have a maximum of four (4) races per day, except Optimists who may race up to seven (7) per day.

9 VENUE

- 9.1 The racing areas will be on the waters adjacent to the Port Credit Yacht Club Harbour entrance and will be detailed in the Supplementary Sailing Instructions.

10 COURSES

Courses to be sailed will be stated in Appendix S and Supplementary Sailing Instructions.

11 SCORING

11.1 One race is required to be completed to constitute a series.

11.2

- (a) When fewer than five (5) races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.
- (b) When five (5) to nine (9) races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.
- (c) When ten (10) or more races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her two worst scores.
- 11.3 Results will be available online at https://theclubspot.com/register/regatta/ZQMRkkKPrU/class and may also be posted under the Event Tent.

12 SUPPORT AND COACH BOATS:

12.1 [DP] Support and Coach Boats shall be identified and equipped with working and monitored Marine VHF Radios. When Code flag V is displayed, all Support and Coach Boats shall be utilized as Safety Boats and shall be under the direction of the Race Committee.

12.2 [DP] Coach and Support Boats will be provided an identifying flag which they shall display on their boats at all times while on the water. A \$20 CASH, refundable deposit is required for the identifying flag.

13 BERTHING AND CAMPING

13.1 [DP] Coach boats and dinghies must be kept in their assigned areas, which are designated in the Supplementary SIs and found at

https://theclubspot.com/register/regatta/ZQMRkkKPrU/class.

Competitors and coaches must respect members' boats including wake reduction when leaving and entering the harbour.

- 13.2 [NP] If you are planning on using a visitor's dock at PCYC during the event, ensure that you book your spot with the Harbourmaster at harbourmaster@pcyc.net as space is limited.
- 13.3 [NP] Fuel may be obtained at the Lakefront Promenade Marina on **Monday-Thursday 11am-7pm and Friday 9am to 7pm.**
- 13.4 [NP] Limited camping is available in designated areas only on a first come first serve basis. Anyone wishing to camp must complete the Camping Registration Application by July 15, 2025 at https://pcyc.net/camping and be accepted. Additional information can be found on the website. All groups camping must have an adult chaperone on site at all times and provide onsite contact information. The committee reserves the right to deny camping privileges. 14 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY/RISK STATEMENT

Racing Rules of Sailing 3 states: "The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue racing is hers alone."

By participating in this event, each competitor agrees and acknowledges that sailing is a potentially dangerous activity with inherent risks. These risks include strong winds, rough seas, sudden changes in weather, failure of equipment, boat handling errors, poor seamanship by other boats, loss of balance on unstable platforms and fatigue resulting in increased risk of injury. Inherent in the sport of sailing is the risk of permanent injury or death by drowning, trauma, hypothermia or other causes.

The Organizing Authority will not accept any liability for material damage, personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during or after the event.

15 INSURANCE

Each participating boat must be insured with valid third-party liability insurance or the equivalent.

16 PRIZES

16.1 Prize flags are awarded to the first three finishers of each properly constituted class/division. Other prizes may be awarded at the discretion of the Organizing Authority.

16.2 The following trophies and dailies will also be awarded:

- John Weakley Memorial Trophy for most improved novice
- Noble Award for Sportsmanship

- Top Optimist Overall
- Suzuki Cottage Challenge awarding 1st, 2nd, and 3rd burgee hull stickers to the top 3 C420 spinnaker and white sail Cottage Club sailors in each race
- Ethel Thayer Cottage Cup to the cottage club whose sailors achieve the best overall performance (excluding graduates)
- Steerers' Trophy to the club whose sailors achieve the best overall performance (excluding graduates)
